


Tabernacle Prayer Guide




What is the Tabernacle Prayer?

In the Old Testament, the Tabernacle was the place where God chose to meet with His people. Every part of it was designed with purpose, and as the Israelites moved through its seven stations, they were guided step by step into God's presence.

Today we don't need a physical Tabernacle to experience God, but the same pattern still helps us draw close to Him. This prayer guide walks you through each station and uses its meaning to shape a simple, powerful way to connect with God every day.

The Outer Court




1. The Outer Court

THANKSGIVING AND PRAISE

***"Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name."
Psalm 100:4***

The Israelites entered the Tabernacle with thanksgiving and praise, and we can start our prayer time the same way. Begin by thanking God for who He is and what he has done. Praise Him for his character: faithful, good, merciful, present. Reflect on moments where you've seen His kindness this week.

The Brazen Altar


2. The Brazen Altar

THE CROSS OF JESUS

"Praise the Lord... who forgives all your sins." Psalm 103:2-5

In the Old Testament, everyone had to regularly bring animal sacrifices to the Tabernacle as payment for their sins. Today, we don't have to do that because Jesus paid for our sins once and for all with His blood on the cross. Reflect on these gifts from Christ's work: Forgiveness of every sin. Healing-physical, emotional, relational. Redemption-God reclaiming what was lost.

The Laver


3. The Laver

CLEANSING & PREPARING YOUR HEART

"Offer your bodies as a living sacrifice..." Romans 12:1

The laver was a bowl of water in the Tabernacle where people would wash themselves. Invite God to search your heart and cleanse you. Offer every part of yourself to His purposes.

The Golden Candlestick


4. The Golden Candlestick

THE HOLY SPIRIT'S FILLING

"Not by might, nor by power, but by my Spirit..." Zechariah 4:6

In the Tabernacle was a golden candlestick. The fire represents the Holy Spirit and our call to be light in the world's darkness. Invite the Holy Spirit to fill, guide, and empower you. Pray through the fruit of the Spirit: Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control.

The Table of Showbread


5. The Table of Showbread

THE WORD OF GOD

"Keep this Book of the Law always on your lips; meditate on it day and night..." Joshua 1:8

Next in the Tabernacle was the Table of Showbread, holding twelve loaves that reminded Israel of God's constant presence and daily provision. Today, this points us to the nourishment we receive as we spend time in God's Word. Open Scripture and let God feed your soul. Read slowly. Reflect on a key phrase. Ask God what he wants you to obey, trust, or remember. End by claiming one promise to carry with you.

The Altar of Incense


6. The Altar of Incense

WORSHIP & GOD'S NAMES

"The name of the Lord is a strong tower..." Proverbs 18:10

Near the entrance to the Holy of Holies stood the Altar of Incense. Its continual smoke symbolized the prayers and worship of God's people rising to him. This station reminds us to pause and lift our hearts in worship and adoration. Let worship rise from your heart.

The Ark of the Covenant

7. The Ark of the Covenant

INTERCESSION

"I urge... that requests, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people."

1 Timothy 2:1

The final place in the Tabernacle was the Holy of Holies, where God's presence dwelled. There the priests would intercede on behalf of the people of God just as we are called to intercede on behalf of those around us. End your prayer time by lifting others to God.
